

Jean-Claude Collomb

My father Jean-Claude Collomb, was born in Bourg-en-Bresse on January 17, 1945. He studied wood carving and was admitted to the École des Beaux-Arts in Mâcon. He gave sculpture classes at a vocational high school, the Carriat high school in Bourg-en-Bresse.

As a sculptor, he created furniture in the Bresse style with decorative elements such as rosettes, acanthus leaves, and finely carved water flowers with such finesse and great sentimental value. His creations include Egyptian bas reliefs, holy virgins, and even created a medallion of Georges Brassens and his cat. He had fingers of gold when he created coats of arms and items of heraldry.

My father was also a painter specializing in pictorial pieces. He taught me how to draw at a very young age and I look to him for inspiration up to today as I look at the art he created. He had given me all this wealth.

Jean-Claude Collomb died in March 2015
